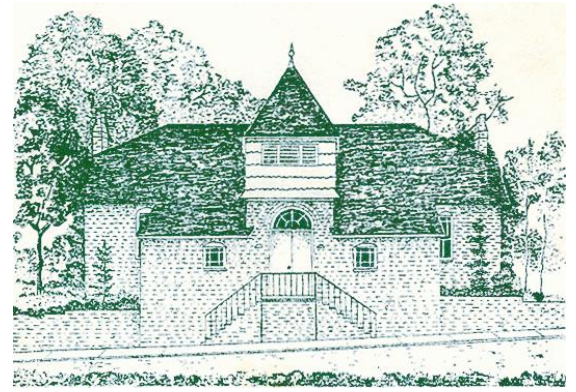

Notes from the meeting on Dec.5

The owners of the property at 328 Main St. in Reisterstown (located between Harryman House and Java Mamas) presented a plan to raze the existing building and build a 2 story pitched roof structure with an indoor auto repair addition in the rear. It has been approved by Baltimore County. Concerns were raised about lighting and landscaping in the rear that backs up to homes in Glyndon Trace. Detailed drawings will be furnished to ROG. Baltimore County Police precinct 3 reported an increase in burglaries especially recyclable metals. Cooperation and records from scrap metal dealers led to arrest and/or recovery in some cases.

Baltimore County has maintained its AAA bond rating due to the conservative financial policies and responsible spending within the budget

Pumpkin Bread Recipe

This is the recipe that I made for the December meeting. It makes a LOT, but you can freeze it well. Enjoy! -Mary

Yields 2 1/2 loaves or 10 mini loaves.

3 1/3 cup flour
2 tsp baking soda
2 tsp salt
1 tsp cinnamon
1 tsp nutmeg
1 cup oil
3 cup sugar
4 eggs
2/3 cup water
1 large can Libby's Easy Pumpkin (dark brown and orange can)

Place all ingredients in a large mixing bowl. Combine thoroughly. Bake at 350 degrees for 60-70 minutes for large loaves or 30-35 minutes for small loaves, until a toothpick comes out clean.
