



Sew Much Comfort

A New Project!

This 501c3 organization offers free adaptive clothing for wounded service members. It is one of the partnering organizations with GFWC. Clubs can become involved through donations for shipping costs and purchase of materials or by providing t-shirts with team logos.

We contacted the Ravens and they have responded with some tee shirts, which will be sent to the distribution center. There are 200 volunteer seamstresses throughout the country who create Velcro openings in the side and/or shoulder seams so injured military do not have to "live" in hospital gowns to accommodate unwieldy devices and difficulty in dressing. Though unfamiliar with Sew Much Comfort until our club sent brochures and a plea for in kind support, the Ravens organization is impressed with the mission and will continue to funnel items to this cause.

So, this project has a positive beginning. Any of you who have a "connection" at any team, e.g. Orioles, Blast, Terps, Ironbirds, please let me know so we can expand the project.
