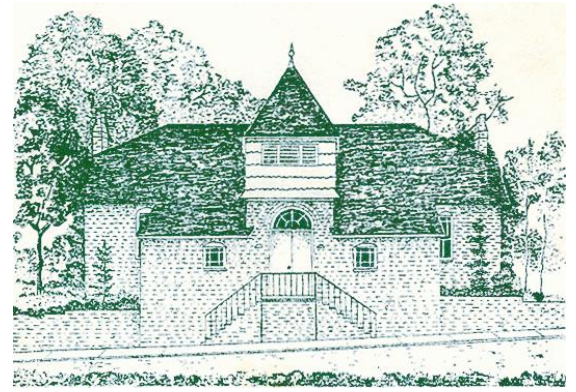

Dear Ladies,

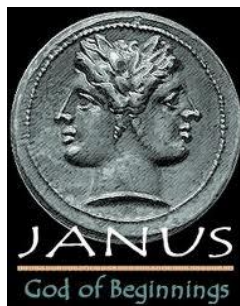

ROG

Notes from the meeting on Jan.2

The main issue was a discussion of the redistricting which places Reisterstown in District 10 along an arc stretching from Woodlawn, through Liberty Rd communities and around to some areas of Harford County. Owings Mills remains in District 11. It is the feeling of ROG that district lines are more appropriately drawn along major transportation corridors such as Liberty Rd, Reisterstown Rd, and York Rd so that similar community interests exist. A letter to that effect was drafted to be sent to Gov. O'Malley and all state legislative members in the present 10th and 11th Districts. Letters from individuals and organizations are encouraged. If the redistricting is not altered in the legislative session, it may be challenged in court where citizen input is considered.

A committee will research the Comprehensive Zoning Map issues in the area and invite applicants requesting changes to come to a ROG meeting to present their cases. Then ROG will decide to support or oppose each issue.

Cherries & Cream Trifle

- 1 Angel food cake, cut into pieces
- 2 cans cherry pie filling
- 1 8oz. pkg. cream cheese
- 1 cup confectioner's sugar
- 2 envelopes of Dream Whip

Mix the Dream Whip according to directions on the package. Add the confectioner's sugar and cream cheese to the Dream Whip. Put a third of the mixture in the bottom of the trifle bowl. Alternate layers of cake, cream mixture, and cherries. End with a layer of cherries.
